Achievement Update – Pānui / Pangarau / Tuhituhi

Last week, we shared Ngāti Toa School's achievement goals and targets for Pānui (Reading) and Pangarau (Maths). This week, we'd like to explain our Tuhituhi (Writing) goals, which are slightly different as we are focusing on targeted groups of ākonga (students).

Ngāti Toa School uses AsTTle assessments, which report ākonga achievement using curriculum sub-levels, such as: 1B → 1P → 1A → 2B → 2P → 2A → 3B → 3P → 3A → 4B → 4P → 4A.

These sub-levels will be used to measure progress in 2025.

Tuhituhi (Writing) Goals and Targets

Writing Goal / Whāinga:

All ākonga will improve their writing achievement by at least 1 sub-level, or more.

Writing Targets:

- Years 1–3: 30% of students will improve by 1 sub-level or more. (Note: This percentage reflects the challenge of progression at this curriculum level due to the wide range.)
- Years 4–6: 50% of students will improve by 1 sub-level or more.
- Year 7 (ākonga who currently sit at 2B–2A): 50% will progress to at least 3A. (This is a significant shift, but we are confident in achieving it.)



PB4L Support – Ngā Uara

Over the past two weeks, kaiako have been teaching and reinforcing positive behaviour expectations in the corridors. These expectations help ensure our shared spaces are calm, safe, and respectful.

Corridor Expectations:

- Move safely and calmly
- Respect the learning of others
- Keep belongings stored tidily

When these expectations are followed, our corridors become much more welcoming and pleasant for everyone.

These expectations also reflect and strengthen our school values / Ngā Uara, especially Aroha – showing care and respect for others and our environment.

Te Wiki o te reo Māori

The last week of this term is te wiki o te reo Māori. Ngāti Toa School kaiako and kaiawhina promote te reo Māori everyday through instruction and using ngā kupu māori as much as possible. Te wiki o te reo Māori is an opportunity to promote te reo through everyday activities. Many whānau use te reo Māori at home. Ka tata mai te wiki o te reo Māori. SchoolDocs is an online policy platform for schools in Aotearoa. Your SchoolDocs site contains policies that are specific to your school and can be accessed by the whole school community.

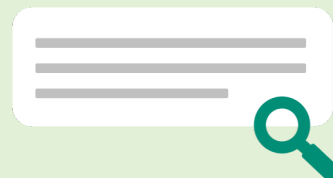
