Our focus this term for our ākonga is **Kotahitanga** — when we work together and support each other, we win together.

There are many occasions where kotahitanga can be demonstrated in everyday life. Please use the word Kotahitanga when you see it in action to help reinforce its meaning and understanding with your tamaiti. This will support our learning and culture here at school as well.

Attendance - Taenga ki te kura

Congratulations to all our whānau for sending your tamaiti to school every day in term 3. Our official attendance for Term 3 was 51% regular attendance – meaning 51% of our ākonga were at school regularly, with fewer than 5 days absent during the term. This is an improvement from 46% in Term 2, showing a 5% increase in regular attendance!

More time at school means more learning, more progress, and more chances for success. Our goal for the rest of the year is to reach 56% regular attendance, and with your continued support, we're confident we can get there together.

SchoolDocs is an online policy platform for schools in Aotearoa. Your SchoolDocs site contains policies that are specific to your school and can be accessed by the whole school community.

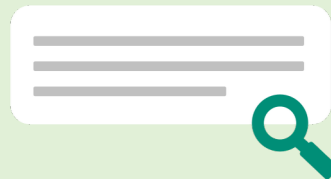
